The Power of Together

I. The Bible gives us dramatic revelation of how people working together can cause unusual things to happen in the world (Ecclesiastes 4:9-12).

- A. Provision— "a good return for your labor" (Ecclesiastes 4:9).
- B. Protection-covering each other when we are at risk (Ecclesiastes 4:10-12)
- C. Power-accomplishing the impossible. "Nothing they plan to do will be impossible for them" (Genesis 11:1-9).

II. God bought the Church "with His own blood" (Acts 20:28).

- A. We have the power to be the salt and light of the earth (Matthew 5:13-16).
- B. The Church of Jesus Christ is a holy nation in the midst of the nations (I Peter 2:9).
- C. We are one in Spirit but diverse in language and culture (Acts 2:1-13, 36-41).
- D. The power of unity is offered to all believers in every land (Acts 2:42-47).
- E. The greatest challenge for all believers is division from within (Acts 6:1-7).

III. The greatest opportunity for all believers is found when they are of one heart and mind and pray from a place of unity. If great power is released among harmonizing, disobedient people (Genesis 11:1-9), what is possible for God's holy, blood-bought nation when they cry out in prayer for the world (Psalm 133; Matthew 18:18-20)?

- A. What does it mean to "agree about anything they ask for?"
 - 1. It means to purposely gather for prayer to Jesus (Matthew 18:20).
 - 2. It means to relationally agree (harmonize-sumphoneo) (Matthew 18:19, 21-35).
- B. Two great mysteries
 - 1. How often we don't pray with those who are closest to us relationally.
 - 2. How those who often partner together in prayer experience deep fellowship.
- C. Examples of pray partnerships in the Bible
 - 1. Paul carried the Philippians in his heart. Who do you carry? (Philippians 1:3-11)
 - 2. Paul and the Colossians (Colossians 4:2-4)
 - 3. Epaphras and the Colossians wrestling in prayer for one another (Colossians 4:12)
 - 4. Confessing our weaknesses and praying for one another (James 5:16)
- IV. God is looking for people who will pray His purposes and desires onto the earth (Ezekiel 22:30).
 - A. Jesus taught that we should pray with "shameless audacity" (Luke 11:5-13).
 - B. James explained that we do not have, because we do not ask (James 4:2-3).
 - C. We are an Elijah generation (James 5:16-18).
 - D. Elijah declared God's will and then prayed it in. Notice the delay, even when Elijah knew he had the answer (7 times) (I King 18:41-45).
