Memorials

- I. The memorials we build and honor are significant, because clear memories of the past prepare us for a better future (E.g., Lincoln Memorial, Battleship Arizona Memorial).
 - A. The desecration of memorials during the recent national unrest is meant to influence our interpretation of historical events and our perception of who we are as a people.
 - B. God's people in the Old Testament set up memorials to shape the future of new generations so that their descendants would respond to the world according to God's point of view.
 - 1. Example of Jacob and the stones of remembrance he set up 4,000 years ago (Genesis 28:10-22). This memorial is still shaping history today.
 - 2. The twelve stones Joshua took from the Jordan River and set up at Gilgal were important for Israel's perception of their identity and future among the surrounding nations (Joshua 4:1-9, 19-24).
 - 3. Samuel and the Ebenezer stone, "Stone of Help" (I Samuel 7:10-13)
- II. Two memorial lifestyles that always get heaven's attention: prayers and gifts to the poor (Acts 10:1-8). "Your prayers and gifts to the poor have come up as a memorial offering before God" (Acts 10:4).
 - A. In the story of Peter and Cornelius, we see how God worked through them to write a new redemptive history.
 - B. Cornelius' prayers and gifts to the poor are called "a memorial offering before God." Similarly, today we remember God in these ways; and He remembers us. This causes redemptive history to progress in our lives and the people's lives around us.
 - C. Peter was also praying as his destiny with the Gentiles unfolded (Acts 10:9-29; 11:15-18).
 - D. Jesus was very clear about the lifestyle of prayer and generosity, and the legacy it leaves behind.
 - 1. Prayer (Matthew 18:18-20)
 - 2. Generosity and the woman who gave extravagantly (Matthew 26:6-13)
 - E. The many expressions of prayer and generosity flowing from our church to the community
- III. Remember that your testimonies are the gateway to your ministry to the world (Acts 3:6-10).
 - A. "Silver or gold I do not have; but what I do have, I give to you" (Acts 3:6).
 - B. What is your story so far? Remember to give it away to others.
